The above statement was the last straw in causing me to write you, and I think when you've read my letter, you'll understand why.

Randy Camp is the last person who ought to be talking about family values. I know. He was my son-in-law for 20 years. He has put the Roland family through emotional pain for two decades, but my daughter Lisa (Randy's ex-wife) is the one who bore the brunt of it all.

Randy started with blatant infidelity here at home. We live in a rural area, so it was almost like he didn't care that we knew that he was cheating on our daughter. Everyone knew it. Then the cheating spread around the area and to Nashville. When Lisa finally caught him, she divorced him.

The court awarded Lisa \$1,600 a month alimony. Unwilling to pay even that amount, Randy took Lisa back to court to try to avoid paying her any money at all, an action that cost her another \$10,000 in legal fees. The court again ruled for Lisa. He was even dishonest during trial proceedings.

After all these years of infidelity, and then the emotionally exhausting legal process, we thought the nightmare was finally over – but Randy became a candidate for state senate 30 days later.

In his advertising, Randy says he's a farmer. Not only is he not a farmer, but during the time they were married, he spent half his time in Nashville, not in Crockett County. The dishonesty he showed the Roland family, he's now showing you.

Because of all Lisa had been through, I wrote and begged him not to use the children and our great grandson in his politics. He has ignored my request.

We are a little country family. We vote, but we aren't political. But we do have unique knowledge about Randy Camp that no one else has. It just wouldn't be right for us to sit here and watch all this dishonesty and disrespect for families and not speak out. That's why I'm writing - because it would be wrong to have this information and not share it with you when Randy is already misleading voters with his campaign.
